Where are we at in responding to Domestic and Family Violence

Domestic and Family Violence is an area and one where specialist services play a vital role in responding to those impacted by violence. But there is also a broader role for churches and other organisations to be places of welcome, safety and support for those impacted by abuse.

We have a person or people dedicated to maintaining our information and resources and who can act as a link to local services				
Our key people engage in regular training updates				
Domestic and Family violence responses are supported by a church wide policy within the context of Professional Standards and Safeguarding and regular training is undertaken on this policy
